WCF Ch 20, Of Christian Liberty and Liberty of Conscience, 1: The liberty which Christ hath purchased for believers under the gospel consists 1) in their freedom from the guilt of sin, 2) the condemning wrath of God, 3) the curse of the moral law; 4) and in their being delivered from this present evil world, 5) bondage to Satan, and 6) dominion of sin, 7) from the evil of afflictions, 8) the sting of death, 9) the victory of the grave, and 10) everlasting damnation; as 11) also in their free access to God, and 12) their yielding obedience unto him, not out of slavish fear, but a childlike love, and a willing mind. All which were common also to believers under the law; but under the New Testament the liberty of Christians is further enlarged 13) in their freedom from the yoke of the ceremonial law, to which the Jewish Church was subjected; and 14) in greater boldness of access to the throne of grace, and 15) in fuller communications of the free Spirit of God, than believers under the law did ordinarily partake of.

WLC Q. 135. What are the duties required in the sixth commandment? A. The duties required in the sixth commandment are, all careful studies, and lawful endeavours, to preserve the life of ourselves and others by resisting all thoughts and purposes, subduing all passions, and avoiding all occasions, temptations, and practices, which tend to the unjust taking away the life of any (1 Sam. 26:9-11); by just defence thereof against violence, patient bearing of the hand of God, quietness of mind, cheerfulness of spirit; a sober use of meat, drink, physic, sleep, labor, and recreation; by charitable thoughts, love, compassion, meekness, gentleness, kindness; peaceable, mild, and courteous speeches and behavior: forbearance, readiness to be reconciled, patient bearing and forgiving of injuries, and requiting good for evil; comforting and succoring the distressed, and protecting and defending the innocent.
