A. General Areas of Temptation -- 1 John 2:15-17

- 1. The "Lusts of the Flesh"
- 2. The "lusts of the eyes"
- 3. The "Pride of Life"
- 4. Illustration: Temptation of Eve -- Genesis 3

B. "Stones to Bread"-- Luke 4:1-4

- 1. Temptation with "Self-Actualization"
 - a. Satan is not doubting Jesus' identity as God's Son
 - b. Not Jesus' attempt to prove his messiah-ship
 - c. But self-actualization: "If you can do it, then do it!"

2. Temptation with "Self-Gratification"

- a. Jesus had a legitimate physical need
- b. We all have legitimate physical needs
- c. Temptation is
 - 1) To employ non-sanctioned means of fulfilling need
 - 2) To morph "needs" into "wants" and then "demands"
 - 3) Own pleasure takes precedence over obeying God

3. Temptation with "Self-Preservation"

- a. Starvation beginning at 40 days
- b. "A man will give all that he has for his own life"

4. Temptation with "Self-Autonomy"

- a. Jesus' use of Deuteronomy 8:3
- b. Our adversary says that "man lives by bread alone"
- c. Temptation-- Our will takes precedence over God's
- d. Jesus' food-- "To do the will of him who sent me"
- e. Our call to "self-denial"-- Matt 16:24-25; 6:33
