Psalm 131:1

How does "hope in the Lord" help calm and quiet your soul? Read Psalm 130:5-7. What do these verses indicate about having "hope in the Lord"? How should this hope cause Christians to respond differently than people who do not know the Lord personally? In what ways can you encourage others to trust in the Lord in uncertain times? Who are some specific people whom you could encourage at this time?
