Follow-Up Questions

- 1. Think of some Biblical examples of people to follow.
 - a. Read 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1. Paul repeatedly in his epistles tells his readers to imitate him. In his case, this is not self-worship. Instead, there is an important qualifier in 11:1. What is it?
 - b. Read either Acts 13:22 or 1 Samuel 13:14. Obviously David wasn't perfect. But what things about this "man after God's own heart" should we be ready to emulate?
 - c. Think of some folks today that would serve as good examples. How do they exhibit Christ-like qualities?
- 2. It is likely that Paul's reference to "enemies of the cross of Christ" is not to those outside the church but to false teachers. (All unbelievers are Christ's enemies.)
 - a. Read Jeremiah 23:1-2. Why does God call these leaders to account? Look at 23:5. What is the promise despite these false shepherds?
 - b. Read Ezekiel 34:1-6. What does it mean tjat these false shepherds feed themselves rather than the sheep? Does this fit with Paul's warnings in Philippians 3? Read Ezekiel 34:25-31 and refer to John 10. What shepherd are you following?
- 3. How does remembering where are citizenship is help us with our day-to-day life?
 - a. Read 1 Peter 1:3-5 and 1:13-16. Is there a connection between the hope of heaven and holy living?
 - b. Read Ephesians 6:10-14a. Paul tells us to "stand" four different times in this short passage (including "withstand"). The battle is so difficult that we cannot even stand on our own. How can we persevere?
 - c. Do you long for Christ's return & your glorification?
