Some overview & introductory points about MARRIAGE:

- Marriage is MONOGAMOUS one man & one wife
- Marriage is HETEROSEXUAL wife, husband // man, woman
- Marriage is DIVINELY-GIVEN Gen 2
- Marriage is PERMANENT Mal 2:14 / Eph 5:31-32 / Matt 19:
- Marriage is MYSTERIOUS Eph 5.32

The commitment of a married couple:

- YOUR *PURPOSE* must be the glory of God
- YOUR HOPE must be the gospel of grace
- YOUR *HOME* must be the local church
- YOUR *POWER* must be the filling of the Spirit

THESIS — from Ephesians 5.22-24 - God shepherds the wives along ...

Christian wife, God calls you to be...

- 1. Be Wholeheartedly Submissive
- 2. Be Selflessly Reverent

I. <u>BE WHOLEHEARTEDLY SUBMISSIVE!</u> (22-24)

"This equality in personhood and difference in function is beautifully illustrated by the Godhead. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are all equal (John 10:30; 14:9), and yet in function the Son submits to the Father (John 5:19, 20; 6:38; 8:28, 29, 54; 1Cor. 15:28; Phil. 2:5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11), and the Holy Spirit is sent by the Father to testify of and glorify the Son (John 14:26; 15:26; 16:13, 14). Thus, the divinely defined relationship between husband and wife is analogous to the relationship within the Godhead, and the relationship within the Godhead is a pattern of instruction for the family unit." (W.A. Criswell)

A. What: be submissive

B. To Whom: to your own husband

C. How: as to the LORD

- D. Why: the husband is your head/leader/authority
- E. Like what: as the church submits to Christ (24a)
 - **1.knowledgeably** we must KNOW what he wants
 - **2.happily** we get great delight in obeying Him!
 - 3.heartfully we submit & obey internally from within, in the heart
 - 4.worshipfully as an act of/expression of worship to GOD!
 - **5.obediently** we submit by obeying & doing what he calls
 - **6.evangelistically** to be a light to the watching world!
 - 7.**dutifully** it's the right thing to do; God's plan/design for us
 - **8.prayerfully** praying for strength; asking for his help.
 - 9.trustingly we submit, obey & follow trusting His leadership.
- F. How much: in everything

A Christian wife's submission may not always be the easiest or the happiest thing to do, but I promise there will always be true joy for the Christian in glorifying the Lord Jesus and walking in His Ways (Martha Peace).

Some practical applications:

- 1. How can you, Christian wife, submit? Some helpful tips:
 - asking him questions and humbly listening more

- not nagging him A continual dripping on a very rainy day. And a contentious woman are alike.
 Proverbs 27:15
- be quick to respond to a request from husband. Make an effort to remember your husband's past requests and desires and seek to fulfill them when possible.
- Speak well of him publicly especially in front of the kids. Look for the occasional opportunity to draw attention to your husband's positive qualities when you're with other people.
- Make an effort to gain an appreciation for your husband's occupation, trying to understand how important he feels his job activities are.
- honor him with modest beauty & attractiveness that wins HIS eye in a unique & particular way
- keep the kids in line
- keep things confidential when he shares his heart with you The heart of her husband safely trusts her. Proverbs 31:11
- spend money wisely & stay within the budget.
- Begin to admire your husband in nonverbal ways.

2. Negatively, a woman shows **a lack of compassion** when she:

- does things annoying or vexing to her husband (Prov 21.29)
- she doesn't discipline her children as she should (Prov 29.15)
- if she is MORE loyal to others/including the kids than to her husband (Prov 31.11)
- if she argues or pouts or gives the husband the cold shoulder when she doesn't get her way (Prov 21.9)
- when she doesn't stay within their budget limits (Prov 19.14)
- she corrects, interrupts, talks for her husband and is TOO outspoken when others are around (Prov 27.15-16)
- she manipulates him to get her own way (by deceit, tears, begging, nagging, complaining, anger, intimidation) (Luke 10.40)
- she makes decisions without consulting him and agreeing with him first (1 Cor 11.3)
- She directly defies his wishes (1 Sam 15.23)
- she worries about all the decisions he makes and takes matters into her own hands (Phil 4.7-8)
- She doesn't pay attention to what he says (James 1.19)
