Ecclesiastes 12:9-12

## 1. The Wordsmith (vv 9-10).

- **A.** The Character of the Preacher
  - **I)** Which was certainly true of Solomon (I Kgs 4:29-34)
  - 2) Which is to be true of all ministers (and Christians) (Ezra 7:10)
  - 3) The Wisdom of Faithful Ministers (and wise Christians)
    - **a)** A student of Scripture (2 Tim 2:15)
    - **b)** A student of experience: *(i)* His own life (Phil 3:4-7); *(ii)* Nature (1 Cor 11:14-15); *(iii)* History (Rom 15:4); *(iv)* Culture (Acts 17:28)
    - c) A student of the times: (*i*) Knew what needed to be accomplished (Neh 2:17-18); (ii) Knew the prevailing sins inside and outside the Church (Neh 5, 8, 13); (iii) Knew his enemies (Neh 6:14); (iv) Put knowledge in action (Neh 6:15)
- **B.** The Calling of the Preacher (2 Tim 4:2-5)
- ${\bf C}_{{\boldsymbol \cdot}}$  The Care of the Preacher over his work
  - **1)** *Ponder* The need for: (a) Meditation; (b) Application; (c) Prayer
  - 2) Sought out The need for study
  - 3) Arranged [set in order] —
- **D.** The Content of the Preacher's meditation
  - **I)** Acceptable Beauty, pleasure, delight (Pr 15:2)
  - 2) Upright That which is good, righteous;
  - 3) Truth That which aligns with the purposes and design of God in reality, to tell the thing as it is
- **E.** Uses from the Text
  - **I)** This is to be the substance of our study and meditation.
  - 2) This is to be the substance of our conversation (Psa 19:14)

## 11. The Word (v 11).

- **A.** The Quality of the Word
  - **I)** Wisdom (Col 3:16)
  - 2) Knowledge (Mt 22:31-32; Gal 3:16)
- **B.** The Work of the Word (two illustrations)
  - **1)** Prod you to holiness

- **a)** There is a job to be done, to glorify and enjoy God
- **b)** We are not by nature particularly eager to do it
- **c)** So we are prodded by the Word
- **2)** Fix you to the truth
  - a) We are prone to ignorance and incorrectness
  - **b)** We are prone to inconsistency
- **C.** The Giver of the Word
  - **I)** Many human authors (*RP Testimony* 1.5)
  - **2)** One Divine Author (2 Pt 1:21; 2 Tim 3:16)
- ${\bf D}_{\mbox{-}}$  Uses from the Text
  - **1)** These qualities of the Word induce appreciation and provide an apologetic for the Word (*WCF 1.5*)
  - 2) But the conviction and persuasion of the authority of the Bible comes from the Word itself and the Spirit working through the Word (*WCF 1.5*)
  - 3) We ought to love the Scriptures, the Book of books!

## 111. The Warning (v 12).

- **A.** Do not bind your conscience to any other rule
  - **I)** We are to be admonished by the Word of God:
  - 2) We are not to bind our conscience to the doctrines of men (1 Cor 7:23)
- **B.** Beware speculation and innovation
  - **I)** Quantity
  - 2) Quality
  - 3) The impulse of modernism
  - **4)** The warning against speculation and innovation which fills so many books (I Tim I:6-7)
  - **5)** Go to the Word! (Isa 8:20)
- C. Beware the rabbit trail of obsession
  - **I)** What is meant by much study is wearisome to the flesh?
  - 2) Why is much study wearisome to the flesh?
  - 3) God's kindness and condescension in giving us the Word (Psa 40:5)
  - 4) Let us then, ever delight in the Word, wherein we are called by the Lord Christ to come to Him in our weariness and find true rest.
