- II. The LORD is preparing to remove and replace those who do not honor Him. 2:11-36
 - A. Eli's corrupt sons fail to honor the LORD. v. 12-17,22
 - 1. They were worthless men (sons of Belial) who did not know the LORD. v. 12 10:27 25:17,25 II Co. 6:15
 - 2. They failed to follow the regulations of God's law for worship. v. 13-14 Lev. 7:31-34 Deut. 18:3
 - 3. They strong-armed faithful worshipers. v. 15-16 Ezek. 34:1-4
 - 4. They were guilty of gross sexual immorality (pastoral abuse). v. 22b Gen. 38:21 Ex. 38:8 Deut. 23:17 Judges 19:22 20:13
 - 5. Their wickedness impacts the entire community. v. 17 I Co. 5:6
 - 6. They were hard-hearted. 2:25b
 - 7. Their sin invites God's judgment. v. 17 3:13 Mal. 2:1-10 Ezek. 34:7ff James 3:1
 - B. Eli, in rebuking his sons, also fails to honor the LORD. 2:22-25
 - 1. Eli was fully aware of his sons' abuse of their priestly office. v. 22
 - 2. Eli verbally admonishes them, but words are not enough. v. 22-25a 3:13
 - 3. What should Eli have done? Dt. 21:18-21
 - 4. Eli failed because he honored his sons above God. 2:29 4:18
 - 5. God is determined to carry out the judgment which Eli refused to enact. 2:25c
 - a. Like Pharaoh, they are hardened beyond recovery. Ex. 5:2 9:16 Ro. 9:17ff 1:22ff Heb. 10:26-31
 - b. Judgment begins with those who are most spiritually privileged. I Pe. 4:17
 - C. Samuel, in contrast, honors God. 2:11,18-21,26 3:1
 - 1. Why does the author weave Samuel's story into that of Eli's sons? 2:30b
 - 2. While Eli's sons grow in evil, earning the contempt of God and men, Samuel grows physically and spiritually earning the favor of the LORD and men. v. 26
 - 3. Samuel's growth foreshadows that of Jesus. Luke 2:52
 - 4. Eli, who failed so miserably with Hophni and Phinehas, enjoys great success in raising Samuel.
 - D. The LORD pronounces the downfall of Eli's dishonorable house. 2:27-36
 - 1. Your house has enjoyed great privileges. v. 27-28
 - 2. You have horribly abused your privileges. v. 29
 - 3. The root of the problem is that you have failed to honor God. v. 29b,30b
 - 4. The Lord has determined to judge the house of Eli. v. 30-34,36
 - 5. This is a startling fulfillment of Hannah's song. 2:5a,6,4,9bc,10a
 - E. The LORD will replace Eli's house with a faithful Priest who will honor Him. v. 35
 - 1. In the short term, Samuel will serve instead of Eli's sons.
 - 2. In the mid-term, the priestly line of Eli's ancestor Ithimar will be displaced by those of the line of Aaron's son Elieazar, including Zadok. I Ki. 2:26-27
 - 3. Ultimately Christ will serve as a faithful High Priest forever. He. 2:17 5:10 9:11ff

III. Application - Honor the LORD above all others in His church. v. 30b

- A. Let us honor God in our worship.
 - 1. Worship is regulated by Scripture. Acts 2:42 John 4:24
 - 2. Worship is holy. Heb. 12:28 I Cor. 11:29-30 Acts 5:1-11
 - 3. Many fail to honor God in worship. II Tim. 4:3 Mal. 2:7-9 1:6-16
 - 4. Where will you choose to worship?
- B. Let us honor God in our leadership.
 - 1. Many spiritual leaders replace God's authority with their own. Mt. 15:3
 - 2. Some spiritual leaders are greedy, abusive and immoral.
 - 3. Some spiritual leaders refuse to honor God by practicing church discipline. v. 29b
 - 4. God will judge unfaithful leaders who fail to honor Him. 2:25b I Pe. 4:17 Js. 3:1
 - 5. Just because you may have suffered under abusive spiritual leadership doesn't mean that you should give up on Christ's church.
 - 6. What kind of leadership do you seek? I Tim. 3:1-7
 - 7. Thank God for Jesus, our perfect High Priest. Heb. 7:26 Mt. 16:18

IV. Application - Honor God above all others in our homes. 2:29b,30b

- A. Why do kids turn out the way they do?
 - 1. Parents are responsible to train their children well. 2:29b 3;13 Eph. 6:4
 - 2. Children are responsible for the choices they make. v. 25 8:1-3 Col. 3:20 Pr. 15:5 20:11 30:17 Ezek. 18:5ff Luke 2:51-53 Isa. 1:2 Jer. 2:30
 - 3. Ultimately, our children can only be saved by God's sovereign grace. Rom. 9:10ff John 6:37,44 Eph. 2:1ff
- B. Honor God in raising your children -- Don't be like Eli.
 - 1. Instruct and discipline your children. Eph. 6:4
 - 2. Verbal admonition becomes worthless nagging when it is not accompanied by strong disciplinary action. Pr. 19:18 22:15
 - 3. Many parents turn a blind eye to the sins of their children. 2:22 3:13 Pr. 29:15
 - 4. Many parents honor their children above God. Pr. 13:24 Mt. 10:37 Luke 14:26
 - 5. There are particular warnings in this text about parenting our adult children.
 - a. Eli failed to stand up to the sins of his adult sons.
 - b. Your job is not over when your children attain legal adulthood.
 - c. If children are living under your roof or otherwise dependent upon you, you are responsible to establish and enforce standards.
 - d. Whining and nagging without taking action amounts to enabling sin.
 - e. Don't take halfway measures. Fools only understand action. Pr. 26:3
 - f. Don't put your children above God.
 - 6. If you act like Eli, the curses which fell upon his house will fall upon you.
- C. Children, honor God by heeding parental wisdom. Pr. 1:8 Eph. 6:1-3
 - 1. You are greatly privileged, but privilege does not ensure lasting blessing.
 - 2. Don't dishonor God by treating Him lightly or He may judge you by hardening your heart beyond recovery. v. 25c,30b Heb. 4:7 Pr. 29:1

V. Conclusion - Honor God above all else. 2:30b
