

The Clarity of the Bible 1 Corinthians 2:6-16

I. A Doctrinal Statement - The Bible is God's Word to us. It was written by human authors, under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is the supreme source of truth for Christian beliefs and living. Because it is inspired by God, it is the truth without any mixture of error.

(Riverland Hills Baptist Church Statement of Faith)

 - **A.** Obedience enhances understanding John 12:16, 7:16-17
 - **B.** Maturity enhances understanding Hebrews 5:11-14
 - C. Wisdom enhances understanding Proverbs 9:6-11; Psalm 19:7-8, 119:130
 - 1. "Simple" = one who lacks sound judgment, prone to bad decisions, led astray easily.
