

Larger Catechism Q. 191: What do we pray for in the second petition? A. In the second petition, (which is, Thy kingdom come,) acknowledging ourselves and all mankind to be by nature under the dominion of sin and Satan, we pray, that the kingdom of sin and Satan may be destroyed, the gospel propagated throughout the world, the Jews called, the fulness of the Gentiles brought in; the church furnished with all gospel officers and ordinances, purged from corruption, countenanced and maintained by the civil magistrate: that the ordinances of Christ may be purely dispensed, and made effectual to the converting of those that are yet in their sins, and the confirming, comforting, and building up of those that are already converted: that Christ would rule in our hearts here, and hasten the time of his second coming, and our reigning with him for ever: and that he would be pleased so to exercise the kingdom of his power in all the world, as may best conduce to these ends.

Larger Catechism Q. 116: What is required in the fourth commandment?

Tunes: Psalm 102:12-18 (St. Columba, 23A); Psalm 95:6-11 (Dunfermline, 8A)

A. The fourth commandment requireth of all men the sanctifying or keeping holy to God such set times as he hath appointed in his word, expressly one whole day in seven; which was the seventh from the beginning of the world to the resurrection of Christ, and the <u>first day of the week ever since</u>, and so to continue to the end of the world; which is the Christian sabbath, and in the New Testament called *The Lord's day*.

Larger Catechism Q. 51: What was the estate of Christ's exaltation?

A. The estate of Christ's exaltation comprehendeth <u>his resurrection</u>, ascension, sitting at the right hand of the Father, and his coming again to judge the world.
