The Vine and the Branches John 15:1-8

Main Point:

Abide in Jesus and accept the Father's pruning so that you bear much fruit and glorify God.

- 1. As the true vine, Jesus is the source of your spiritual fruitfulness.
- 2. This is why you must abide in Him and let His words abide in you.
- 3. As the vinedresser, the Father is committed to your spiritual fruitfulness.
- 4. This is why you must accept and learn from His work of pruning.
- 5. In doing these things, you will glorify the Father and prove your salvation.

Isaiah 5:7 7 For the vineyard of the LORD of hosts *is* the house of Israel, And the men of Judah are His pleasant plant. He looked for justice, but behold, oppression; For righteousness, but behold, a cry *for help.* (NKJV)
