Hebrews 9:1 the first covenant had regulations for worship and an earthly place for holiness.

ii. Jesus Christ: Our great hope for drawing near to God

Hebrews 7:19 a better hope is introduced, through which we draw near to God

He is a merciful, faithful, and permanent high priest (2:17, 7:24)

He was tempted just as we are, yet without sin (4:15)

He offered himself as the unblemished, once-for-all sacrifice to put away sin (8:3, 7:27, 9:14, 26)

He made propitiation for the sins of the people so that our sins are taken away and God remembers them no more (2:17, 8:12, 10:4, 17)

He is the mediator of a new and better covenant (7:22, 9:15) He has passed through the heavens and entered into the holy presence of God for us (4:14, 6:19)

He entered the true, heavenly tabernacle once for all (8:1-5, 9:12)

He is seated at the right hand of God for us and appears in the presence of God on our behalf (8:2, 9:24)

He opened the way into the holy place so that we can draw near to God (9:8, 7:19)

He is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them (7:25)

He ensures that those who are called will receive the promised eternal inheritance because he enrolls them in the assembly of the firstborn in heaven (9:15, 12:23)

Hebrews 10:19–22 Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.
