

- Mourning over lost worship opportunities since in exile
 - Our lost opportunities today
 - God will gather

- Repentance!

- Daily repentance, Deuteronomy 30.2-3

- Dealing with oppressors, 3.19
 - Persecuted church

- Zephaniah's familiarity with Deuteronomy, cf. 26.18-19

- Reflecting God's glory, Zechariah 9.16-17; Isaiah 43.6b-7; Jeremiah 33.8-9; I Peter 2.9-10
- The warning to listen: Jeremiah 13.11
- Timothy Stoner: Holy Love Wins
