

The immutability of God, meaning that God never changes. Hebrews 6:13-19

God is same today as He was in the beginning of the creation. God is eternally and infinitely perfect; God is ever constant and never changing.

He is everlastingly the same; He is impeccable and spotless; and He is unchangeably holy and righteous. He is never different!

God is righteous in all His ways and holy in all His works, and He will never be different from what and who He has always been!

He is the ONLY ONE that we can ALWAYS depend upon to be unwavering and unmovable; His promises and His warnings will always be faithful and true. Deuteronomy 32:1-4, 15, 18, 30-31

There will never be a time when God gets old & weary; He will never be outdated or need to be updated. His wisdom, knowledge, understanding, and counsel will always be relevant and applicable in every way! His Word is perfect! None of His commands will ever be countermanded.

Psalms 119:89, 152, 160, Isaiah 46:10, Matthew 24:34-35, 1 Peter 1:22-25

God will NEVER be MORE or LESS than He is!

For God to need to be MORE would be to say that He is NOT all sufficient or enough! If that were the case, God would cease to be God.

He was the All Sufficient God in the beginning, and He is still the All Sufficient God; nothing has changed about Him. Furthermore, His Almighty and Sovereign power and Supremacy will never be less than it is now; God will never lack, need, or want; to say that God is deficient would be to say that God must change, and that cannot be, for then He would cease to be God.

God is AS eternally and everlastingly the same NOW AS He will be if time continues to the year 2500; if the year 3105 ever comes, God will be exactly the same then, as He is now.

His knowledge and wisdom will never diminish, and there will never be a time when He says within Himself that something unforeseen has come up.

There has never been a time when He was not God, and there will never be a time when He will cease to be God. Psalms 102:25-27.

God does not evolve or change with the times, He thinks precisely the same way that He thought in the beginning of time and even before there was such a thing as time.

Once again, understand that if anything about God was to change, God would cease to be God.

You've heard many a man or woman say, I am who I am; I am not going to change!

But we're always changing our minds and our attitudes and our opinions about things; sometimes for the better, and sometimes for the worse.

But we NEED to change because of what we were when we came into the world; we need to be changed by God from rebellious sinners to obedient saints. Ye must be born-again; CHANGED from within by the Spirit of the unchanging God.

And, God saves sinners JUST like He did 1000, 2000, or 3000 years ago. By faith alone in Christ!

To us who are saved, as long as we shall live in this life, we are in constant need of being changed by the Spirit of the unchanging God; the most consistently spiritual consistent Christians are those who have rooted themselves upon the unchanging God and His Son the Lord Jesus Christ.

God does not change!

Since God is immutable: His Word, His Promises, His love, His mercy, nothing about Him will ever change or be different.

Exodus 3:11-15, John 8:58

Psalm 33:9-11, Hebrews 13:8, James 1:17, Numbers 23:19,

Psalm 110:4, Hebrews 6:13-20.

Why then does God say that He did repent or change in these passages?
