Sermon: "You Thought it Couldn't Get Worse!" What's Wrong With You People? Pt. 46

## I Text:

Old Covenant: *Judges 17* New Covenant: *John 4:1-24* 

## **II Doctrine:**

The Book of Judges gives a glimpse into the spiritual abyss the Hebrews have fallen into. The story of Micah gives an inside look concerning false worship. Just as we read in the Sampson narrative, Micah's family is tolerant of evil. The living God does not tolerate false worship, he only allows it for a time out of mercy.

The central theme of every apostate age is summed up in these verses of Judges. Men have become so infantile and wicked in their worship, they make up their own rules. When God's people lose reverence for the commands of God, they are fit to be slaves. The main calling of the future leaders in Israel, is to enforce the commands of the Lord. Micah like "evangelicals" in our modern age makes it up as he goes along!

Those who promulgate false worship like to use the trappings of true worship. Micah thought he could legitimize his syncretistic worship by using a Levite for his worship services. Just like in our age anti-christ Churches use crosses, Bibles, Priests, and Pastors to promote idolatry. The book "Christianity and Liberalism" by J.
