Hosea, Prophet to Israel

- Hosea's name means 'salvation'
- Prophet to the northern kingdom, Israel (also called Ephraim after its largest tribe)
- Prophesying from 758-722 BC (his prophetic ministry dated by Judean kings: Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz and Hezekiah
- Hosea was a contemporary of Isaiah, who prophesied in the southern kingdom of Judah
- Longest book of the 12 minor prophets
- The genre of the book is prophecy with mostly oracles of judgment in poetic satire presented as a legal or judicial indictment by God against his covenant people
- Off and on threat of the Assyrian empire
- Hosea prophesied during the last hours of Israel, since the northern kingdom was taken into exile by Assyria in 722 BC
- Began ministry at the end of the prosperous reign of Jeroboam II and during the most turbulent reigns of six kings who followed in rapid succession within about 30 years (Zechariah to Hoshea; four were murdered and one was taken into exile)
- Passionate writing with striking metaphors
