II. CHRISTIANS ARE MATURED BY SUFFERING

- A. God's good is that we should be conformed to the image of Jesus Christ. Anything that makes us like Jesus is good.(Romans 8:28,29)
- B. Suffering gives opportunity for us to appropriate what we are in Him and for His life to be made manifest in us. (Romans 12:2, Phil 3:21, Philippians 3:10, 2Corinthians 4:11-12)
- C. By cooperating with the Lord we let our sufferings produce endurance, Christ like character and see His working for us (Ephesians 1:11)
 - Anyone who has been saved for awhile can attest-God will use anything and everything. What is the Lord using in your life?

V. SUFFERING BELIEVERS TRUSTING THE LORD ARE A BEAUTIFUL DISPLAY OF CHRIST'S LOVE

"Whether the suffering is for or with Christ may be determined not so much by its nature and severity as by the quality of one's spirit in which it is faced. For example, to live sweetly with a brute of a man, or a contentious faithless woman, or an ungrateful, contemptuous, wayward son or daughter, or to live self-sacrificially with a helpless, hopeless one for years or for a lifetime, may develop martyr strength and a deep dimension of love as truly as severe persecution for Christ's sake. All suffering is to drive one to the Lord. It is intended to work a fuller submission, a more utter devotion, an increasing patience, and a greater beauty of spirit, a more selfless love toward both God and man."- Paul Billheimer

A. How does one learn to truly agape love apart from suffering?

VI. SUFFERING CAN BENEFIT US IS BY CHASTISEMENT WHEN WE BEGIN TO STRAY INTO SIN

*Psalm 86:5, Hebrews 12:5-6 reminds us that those whom the Lord loves, he chastens.

*Proverbs 15:5, Proverbs 29:17, Hebrews 12:9-14....that we may be partakers of His holiness.

VII. WE ERR IN JUDGING GOD BY OUR STANDARDS

"Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh, **arm yourselves also with the same mind**, for he who has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, that he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh for the lusts of men, but for the will of God..." (1 Peter 4:1-2)
