10 And the disciples came and said to Him, "Why do You speak to them in parables?" 11 He answered and said to them, "Because it has been given to you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it has not been given. 12 For whoever has, to him more will be given, and he will have abundance; but whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken away from him. 13 Therefore I speak to them in parables, because seeing they do not see, and hearing they do not hear, nor do they understand. 14 And in them the prophecy of Isaiah is fulfilled, which says: 'Hearing you will hear and shall not understand, And seeing you will see and not perceive; 15 For the hearts of this people have grown dull. Their ears are hard of hearing, And their eyes they have closed, Lest they should see with their eyes and hear with their ears, Lest they should understand with their hearts and turn, So that I should heal them.' 16 "But blessed are your eyes for they see, and your ears for they hear; 17 for assuredly, I say to you that many prophets and righteous men desired to see what you see, and did not see it, and to hear what you hear, and did not hear it.

"And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them and said, 'Take, eat; this is My body."—Mark 14:22.

Q. 30. How doth the Spirit apply to us the redemption purchased by Christ? A. The Spirit applieth to us the redemption purchased by Christ, by working faith in us, and thereby uniting us to Christ in our effectual calling.

Q. 96. What is the Lord's supper? A. The Lord's supper is a sacrament, wherein, by giving and receiving bread and wine according to Christ's appointment, his death is showed forth; and the worthy receivers are, not after a corporal and carnal manner, but by faith, made partakers of his body and blood, with all his benefits, to their spiritual nourishment and growth in grace.

"What is the Lord's Supper?" (Part 3: Consummation)
The Lord's Supper is a holy meal which celebrates commemoration, communion, and consummation.

- I. Commemoration
 - A. We are called upon to remember
 - B. What are we remembering? Passover; Lord's Supper
- II. Communion
 - A. Communion with each other (koinonia)
 - 1. Context: one body, because partakers of the one bread; necessity of

mutual love and care

- 2. We experience communion with each other: common actions/symbols; common faith; common affections toward Christ; common participation in the blessings/benefits of salvation; mutual love and affection; mutual communication; mutual service
 - B. Communion with Christ
 - 1. Communion of the blood of Christ
 - 2. Communion of the body of Christ
 - 3. Partakers of the Lord's table
 - 4. We dare not partake with demons

III. Consummation

A. Proclamation—to "show forth" (katangello) the Lord's death

- B. "'til He comes"
 - 1. Revelation 22:17; I John 3:2-3
 - 2. Every eye shall see Him
 - 3. They shall look on Him whom they have pierced
 - 4. Faith shall become sight

Observations

- A. There is a note of triumph in the Lord's Supper
- B. There is also a note of judgment in the Lord's Supper

Application—remember that there will be fuller participation in glory
