We will study Paul's accomplishment of a return to gospel acceptance through the usage of four rhetorical questions, so that we can better persevere in our faith in the truth of the gospel.

1. Question concerning initiation into salvation (2).

Romans 5:5 God's love comes via the indwelling of the Spirit.
