Sermon: "Samson All Ritual No Spirit" Pt.5- What's Wrong With You People? Pt. 44

## I Text:

Old Covenant: *Judges 15* New Covenant: *2 Peter 2* 

## **II Doctrine:**

We continue the Samson narrative in the book of Judges, and nothing has changed with Samson's impulsive behavior. Each story of his behavior illustrates how reckless and arrogant he is. Samson returns to the woman he was betrothed to marry after deserting her for a while. Her Father assuming Samson would not return following his slaughter of the Philistines, betrothed her to someone else. The Father even offers his younger daughter in marriage, but Samson would not have his anger abated. We as Christians must emulate Christ and control our passions, not fulfill them as taught in many Churches today.

Samson in an act of vengeance uses foxes in a novel way to provoke the Philistines. This reckless act causes the Philistines to burn his former Father in law and wife to death. The response of Samson is another slaughter of Philistine men. God uses imperfect people to achieve victory over his enemies.

The men of Judah are rightfully upset with their fearless leader, His unbridled passions are bringing distress to the people he is supposed to protect. They open a dialogue with Samson questioning his leadership. Samson agrees to let the men of Judah bind him and hand him over to the Philistines as judgment for what he has done.

The deliverance of Samson to the Philistines leads to a famous encounter in history. The Spirit of God allows Samson to take vengeance upon the Lord's enemies, using the jaw bone of a donkey. Samson complains to god about his thirst after the battle. The Lord despite Samson's arrogance supernaturally provides water from the jawbone of the donkey.

The response of Samson is another slaughter of Philistine men. God uses imperfect people to achieve victory over his enemies. (*Judges* 15:3-8; 2 *Peter* 2:4-9)
- 3) The men of Judah are rightfully upset with their fearless leader, His unbridled passions are bringing distress to the people he is supposed to protect. They open a dialogue with Samson questioning his leadership. Samson agrees to let the men of Judah bind him and hand him over to the Philistines as judgment for what he has done. (*Judges 15:9-13*)

4) The deliverance of Samson to the Philistines leads to a famous encounter in history. The Spirit of God allows Samson to take vengeance upon the Lord's enemies, using the jaw bone of a donkey. Samson complains to God about his thirst after the battle. The Lord despite Samson's arrogance supernaturally provides water from the jawbone of the donkey. (*Judges 15:14-20*)
