## b. You Need to Answer Some Questions about the Law and Sanctification (7:7-14)

- 1) A legitimate question: What shall we say then? Is the law sin? (7:7a)
- 2) A definite answer: Certainly not! (7:7b)
- **3)** A theological explanation: On the contrary, I would not have known sin except through the law. (7:7c)
- 4) A perfect example the prohibition of the sin of coveting (7:7d -11)
  - a. **The purpose of the Law:** For I would not have known covetousness unless the law had said, "You shall not covet." (7:7c)
  - b. **The provocation of the Law:** But sin, taking opportunity by the commandment, produced in me all manner of evil desire. (7:8a)
  - c. The practical result of the Law: For apart from the law sin was dead. I was alive once without the law, but when the commandment came, sin revived and I died. (7:8b 9)
  - d. **The personal frustration with the Law:** And the commandment, which was to bring life, I found to bring death. (7:10)

- e. **The personal testimony regarding the Law**: For sin, taking occasion by the commandment, deceived me, and by it killed me. (7:11)
- 5) A doctrinal conclusion: Therefore the law is holy, and the commandment holy and just and good. (7:12)
- 6) Another logical question: Has then what is good become death to me? (7:13a)
- 7) Another dogmatic answer: Certainly not! (7:13b)
- 8) Another theological explanation: But sin, that it might appear sin, was producing death in me through what is good, so that sin through the commandment might become exceedingly sinful. (7:13c)
- **9)** Another personal testimony: For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin. (7:14)
- c. You Need to Understand the BATTLE Within You. (7:15-20) Some questions you need to correctly answer are...
  - 1) Can the inner conflict you experience as a believer be baffling at times? (7:15a)
  - 2) Can the Christian life be lived by your sheer will-power and strength? (7:15b)

  - 4) What is the real source of your spiritual defeat? (7:17)
  - 5) Who is your greatest problem? (7:18a)
  - 6) Does God change your flesh at salvation? (7:18b)
  - 7) Why do believers live in spiritual defeat? (7:18c-20)
- d. You Need to Recognize Three BASIC PRINCIPLES Regarding This Battle. (7:21-25)
