- A. The Lord Uses the Foolishness of a Woman Judge and Prophet
  - **I)** Deborah is not a proto-feminist

    - **b)** She does not go into combat (Dt 22:5)
    - c) She delights in being a mother of Israel (Jdg 5:7)
  - 2) Deborah is an exceptional case (Ex 15:20; 2 Kgs 22:14; Isa 8:3; Lk 2:36; Acts 21:9)
  - 3) Deborah is in an extraordinary office
  - **4)** Deborah is a prophetess
  - 5) Deborah is a judge
  - **6)** Deborah is a mother of Israel (Jdg 5:7)
    - **a)** For she nurtured Israel with tender affection
    - **b)** Deborah is a godly example to Christian women.

- **d)** Use, Younger Christian women are to follow the godly examples of older Christian women (Titus 2:3-5)
- 7) Deborah is figure for the Church:

  - 3) We are neither to think too much of ourselves, nor to think of ourselves too much (I Cor 1:26-31)
