So Far...

- A broad picture: where does the city fit in history?
- Some observations
 - Holy: Glory of God and his holiness
 - Without sea/chaos
 - No tears, death, mourning, crying
 - o The city reflects the glory of God because of what Christ has done.
 - II Corinthians 3.18: And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit.
 - Point for us: God is transforming us to reflect the holiness of his glory in our salvation.
 - God places emphasis on our personal holiness
 - We are to pursue holiness NOW
 - o A bride and a city: symbolism
 - People: who are reflecting the glory of god
 - Even now: seated in the heavenlies in Christ Jesus, Ephesians 1
 - Our treasure/inheritance is safely in heaven

Grand Tour: An angel shows the new Jerusalem.

- Size
- Immense: 1400 miles per side: the immense size symbolizes the immensity of God's purposes
 - A huge city: would stretch from Portland, Maine, in the north, to Jacksonville, Florida, to past San Antonio to the northern border of the United States. This also covers the first century Hellenistic/Mediterranean/Roman world
 - Upward: into the atmosphere- knocking down satellites
- Cube:
 - Like the holy of holies
 - Same measurements: heaven and earth coming together
- The idea of walls gives structure
- Gates: angels, like cherubim at the garden of Eden, provide security
- The number 12; tribes/apostles

- o Represent pre-cross and post-cross believers
- o Apostles are the source of truth
- Architecturally perfect
 - o Measured: like in Ezekiel
 - o Jasper, gold, precious stones: overwhelming riches
- Sheer beauty
 - o Connect with Aaron, with Tyre description, with the coming Jerusalem Isaiah describes
- Gates: 12 pearls
- Transparent glass like gold

Surprises in the City

- No temple: God is the temple, and the Lamb
- Jesus anticipated this: Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." John 2.19
- No sun or moon needed, Isaiah 60.19-20
 - The glory of God/Jesus the light
 - The presence of God
 - Ezekiel's city: 48.35: the name of the city ... the Lord is there.
 - The glory of God a sufficient light
 - o The nations will walk in its light
- Kings of the earth will bring their glory- the fruit of their culture
 - Never shut (secure)
- Lamb's book of life

- Anticipation: our glorious future
