- > With space at a premium, why did Mark get redundant on miraculous feedings?

I. The Story

- a. Feeding the 4,000
 - i. Two chapters ago the feeding of 5,000 men
 - ii. Jesus was in Decapolis 10 cities north and south of the east side of the sea of Galilee.
 - iii. Jesus is in a whole new region with a different demographic and political structure.
 - iv. 4,000 people now hanging on to his every word so that they even neglected to eat!!
 - v. Jesus had compassion.
 - vi. Jesus prayed twice. cf feeding of the 5,000 Jesus prayed once
 - vii. Afterwards He left for Dalmanthua
 - viii. Mark 8: 10-10
- b. The Pharisees get Belligerent
 - i. They demand a sign
 - ii. Sign is a miracle and wonder by which God authenticates the folks sent by Him.
 - iii. Jesus had been busy:
 - 1. Calmed a storm
 - 2. Healed a demon possessed man
 - 3. Raised a dead girl
 - 4. Healed a sick woman
 - 5. Fed 5,000
 - 6. Walked on water
 - 7. Healed a woman of an evil spirit
 - 8. Made the deaf to hear and mute to speak
 - iv. The Pharisees had at least a nodding acquaintance of these miracles
 - v. The Pharisees were too greedy, self centered, self absorbed, selfish, entitled, angry defensive and/or apologetic but it was their sin that compelled them to have unopened eyes and unreceptive hearts.
 - vi. Jesus sighed.
- c. The Leaven of the Pharisees
 - i. Only one loaf to feed all of them the disciples were sweating it!
 - ii. The leaven of the Pharisees and Herod the same thing:
 - 1. Refusing to follow the light they already had.
