Lesson 2: Who am I?

Review: What is the emphasis in I Peter on the character and work of God? _____

Peter knows all about changing identities! He went from fisherman to disciple of Jesus to denier of Jesus to forgiven denier of Jesus to apostle and leader of the early church to revered “elder statesman” of the church. Read what he says about our identity at the very beginning of his letter:

³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴ to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, ⁵ who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. (I Peter 1:3-5)

We saw in Lesson 1 that these verses are packed with truth about who God is! But they also contain one giant truth to answer the question *Who am I?*
