- C. PROXY: MAN FOR MANKIND (Lev.16:21; Is.53:4f; Rom.5:12f(17); 2Cor.5:21)

- 3. Do *you* care about who He is and what He did? Why or why not?
- 4. Have you left everything to follow Jesus? Why or why not?
- 5. What difference does all this make in how you *think* about yourself, your life and the world around you?
- 6. What difference does all this make in how you *live* from day to day?
- 7. What was most helpful in this sermon? Why? How will you apply it in your daily life?
- 8. What verses covered were most helpful? How so?
