Philippians 4:2-7 (982)

Since the beginning of his letter the Apostle Paul has been laying foundations to gently restore two Christian sisters who are apparently squabbling. He has addressed the issue of unity in principle (see 1:27-2:5; 3:17). Now he addresses this Christian dispute gently and directly, calling for agreement “in the Lord” and “reasonableness” (v 2, 5) in the midst of earnest prayer. Learn today key principles in resolving conflict and seek the Lord’s help to graciously “put up” with members of the Lord’s family
