The Communion of Forgiven Saints 1 Corinthians 12:1-27 Heidelberg Catechism 54-56

Main Point:

Out of thankfulness for the work of your Savior, readily and cheerfully use your gifts to bless the church.

1. As a believer in Christ, your sins have been completely forgiven.

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2. As a forgiven sinner, you are a member of the universal body of Christ.
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3. As a member of the body of Christ, you have been given certain gifts in order to bless the church.

4. Out of thankfulness for the work of your Savior, cheerfully use your gifts to bless the church.

Quotations and Cross-References

Heidelberg Catechism 56 Q: What do you believe concerning "the forgiveness of sins"? A: I believe that God, because of Christ's atonement, will never hold against me any of my sins nor my sinful nature which I need to struggle against all my life. Rather, in His grace God grants me the righteousness of Christ to free me forever from judgment.

Heidelberg Catechism 54 Q: What do you believe concerning the "holy catholic church"? A: I believe that the Son of God, through his Spirit and Word, out of the entire human race, from the beginning of the world to its end, gathers, protects, and preserves for himself a community chosen for eternal life and united in true faith. And of this community I am and always will be a living member.

Heidelberg Catechism 55 Q: What do you understand by "the communion of saints"? A: First, that believers one and all, as members of this community, share in Christ and in all His treasures and gifts. Second, that each member should consider it a duty to use these gifts readily and cheerfully for the service and enrichment of the other members.

Ephesians 4:4-8 ⁴ *There is* one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; ⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism; ⁶ one God and Father of all, who *is* above all, and through all, and in you all. ⁷ But to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift. ⁸ Therefore He says: "When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, And gave gifts to men." (NKJV)

G.I. Williamson "Too many 'members' think of the church only in terms of what it gives them, rather than in terms of what they can give others."

RP Testimony 26.3 In addition to their obligation to assemble for worship, believers should assemble for social purposes as another means of support and growth. In response to Christ's love for them, believers are to express their love to one another by using their diverse gifts and talents to help their brethren; by giving and receiving counsel, support, hospitality and comfort; by spending time with one another and sharing joys and sorrows. This is especially necessary when, in the providence of God, brethren need material support and moral and spiritual encouragement.
