 The NT authors make it clear that the timing of the final "day of the Lord" is unknown (Matt. 24:36), will bring about judgment (2 Thess. 1:6-10), the end of opportunity to repent and believe the Gospel (Matt. 25:1-13) and a new heavens and new earth (2 Pet. 3:10-11).

Amos | Background

- Amos provides clear historical parameters for the timeframe of his ministry: the reigns of Uzziah in Judah (783-742 BC) and Jeroboam II Israel (786-746 BC).
- Amos identifies himself as a "sheep breeder" and a tender of sycamore figs from Tekoa (a rugged region of Judah), who is sent to prophesy against the social elite of Israel.
- Amos prophesied to Israel before their exile in a time of prosperity during the reign of Jeroboam II. Inhabitants of Israel believed that their prosperity was largely due to their faithfulness to Yahweh. Amos delivers a very different message.
