1 Thessalonians 2:17-20

The Church in the Heart of Christ **Proposition:** Christ keeps the afflicted church in his heart.

I. The Church Afflicted

a. Orphaned in the World (v. 17)

- i. We lack Christ's physical presence. (2 Pt. 3:4; 1 Co. 5:8)
- ii. We lack Christ's immediate instruction. (cf. Lk. 24:27)

b. <u>Hindered by the Enemy</u> (v. 18)

- i. Our plans are frustrated. (1 Th. 2:14-16; cf. Lk. 4:13)
- ii. God's intentions are obscured. (Jb. 33:14)

II. The Church Beloved

- a. Christ's Present Object of Affection (v. 17, 18)
 - i. Christ keeps us in his heart. (Jn. 14:3)
 - ii. Christ desires to see us face to face. (Jn. 17:24; 1 Co. 13:12)
- b. Christ's Future Crown of Glory (vv. 19, 20)
 - i. We are Christ's boast before God. (Jd. 1:24, 25)
 - ii. *We are Christ's joy in the world to come*. (Zp. 3:17; 3 Jn. 1:4; 1 Th. 2: 11; Ga. 4:19, cf. Jn. 16:21)

III. Our Response

- a. <u>Supplication:</u> If Satan so hinders us, pray for Christ's protection.
 - i. From undue grief in this life.
 - 1. Knowing trials and afflictions must surely come.
 - 2. Knowing he must surely come.
 - 3. Knowing his heart in his Word by the Holy Spirit.
 - ii. From the enemy's opposition.
 - 1. Hinderance within-self, Satan.
 - 2. Hinderance without—world.
- b. Thanksgiving: If Christ so loves us, thank him for his affection.
 - i. As Governing Head of the Church.
 - 1. Conversion of sinners.
 - 2. Preparation for us.
 - 3. Ordination of servants.
 - ii. As Shepherding Savior of the Church.
 - 1. Assurance of affection—despite affliction.
 - 2. Deliverance from affliction—both moral and temporal.
