Context and Introduction:

- 1. The Apostle Paul follows his familiar pattern as in other epistles by laying out first sound doctrine then making practical application... see *Ephesians 1:1 ff cf. Ephesians 5:1 ff...*
- 2. Note Paul's emphasis upon the family... Instruction in the marriage relationship, *Ephesians* 5:22-23... Instruction for children, *Ephesians* 6:1-3
- I. The Position and Vital Importance of Fathers in the Raising of Their Children...
- A. Mothers and Fathers are to both be engaged... Exodus 20:12; Proverbs 1:8; 6:20

 Observations:
 - **B. Paul's Focus in Upon Fathers...** Ephesians 6:4 cf. Colossians 3:21
 - 1. His concern is that "fathers not neglect or abuse their children...
 - 2. It's an awesome responsibility to be a father...
 - 3. The Bible clearly teaches the husband's headship in the home...

Observation: This view is not politically correct!

- 4. Men and women are different...and fathers must guard against being overbearing and harsh...
- II. What a Godly Father Must Not Do... "Father's do not provoke your children to anger..."
- A. The meaning of the phrase... "...provoke to anger..."

Think of words like; embitter, enrage, exasperate, demoralize...

- B. The Father's authority in the home must be exercise with care and wisdom...
- C. It doesn't mean to let children have their way...
- **D.** It does mean to be helpers of their joy... II Corinthians 1:24
- E. There are sad consequences associated with "exasperating children..." Col. 3:21

Application: Positive instruction to prevent provoking our children to anger...

- 5. Be positive and quick and free with encouragement...
