Exodus 18:13-27

- I. Exhausted Leader, Neglected People
 - A. Situation and its explanation to Jethro
 - B. "Moses sat .. the people stood around" (v. 13)
 - C. The people are not getting the attention they need!
 - D. Moses' myopia (see also Exodus 2:14; Exodus 5:21)
- II. How to talk to your leaders
 - A. Jethro is wise
 - B. Church leaders often cannot see beyond the urgent
 - C. Church leaders don't want to push anyone away
- III. Differences of gifts
 - A. Moses takes Jethro's advice
 - B. There are differences of gifts among God's people (Romans 12; 1 Corinthians 12) and among leaders
 - C. Gifts tend to become clear through use
 - D. Not all of Moses' tasks are delegated!
- IV. How delegation happens
 - A. Initiative to get help will sometimes come from *outside* the leadership
 - B. Initiative to get help will sometimes come from within the leadership (Acts 6:1-7)
 - i. Church in Jerusalem: rapid growth
 - ii. Crisis: some are neglected
 - iii. Solution: the next generation of leaders
 - C. A task that can be delegated: mercy ministry
- V. We need more help!
 - A. What do you see?
 - B. Deacon election
- VI. Where is Jesus in this story?
 - A. All Scripture is about the Lord Jesus Christ (see John 5:39; Luke 24:27)
 - B. This passage gives us a picture of Jesus Christ: the hundreds of judges who will step in and help (Romans 15:8; Philippians 2:7; Matthew 11:29-30; Psalm 127:1; Matthew 16:18)
 - C. Jethro's blessing (vv. 19, 23)
