Our Role Model: Caleb

A. His Unshakeable Faith—Numbers 14:7-9

- 1. His unshakeable faith in the power, promises, and presence of God which enabled him to stand against the majority.
- 2. His unshakeable faith was a result of conviction, not heredity. Joshua 14:6; cp. Genesis 15:19
- 3. Because of His unshakeable faith, God promised Caleb an inheritance in the promised land.— Numbers 14:24
 - a. The promise is renewed 38 years later—Deut. 1:34-36
 - b. The promised is realized 45 years later—Joshua 14:6-10

B. His Uncommon Graciousness—Joshua 14:8-10

- 1. Caleb had good reason to be bitter with life or with God.
- 2. Caleb grew old graciously rather than grumpy by...
 - a. Following the LORD, his God, fully.—vv. 8-9, 14
 - b. Seeing each day as a gift from God—v. 10

C. His Indomitable Spirit—Joshua 14:11-15

"Give me this mountain!!!"

- 1. Caleb conserved physical strength for spiritual endeavors.
- 2. The curse of aging is diminished physical energy.
- 3. Caleb refused to quit, give up,, or retire. Saw his greatest challenges still in the future.

D. His Positive Spiritual Impact—Joshua 15:14-19

- 1. Caleb's unshakeable faith and indomitable spirit rubs off on his son-in-law, Othniel, the first judge of Israel.
- Caleb's unshakeable faith and indomitable spirit is seen in his daughter's request for a field and spring of water.
