Food for thought from the Gospel of John "John the Baptist"

#3 John the Baptist

Read Isaiah 40:1-5 and John 1:1-8. Even as the coming of the Messiah was prophesied of old by Isaiah and Malachi, so was a special messenger mentioned in the prophecies — an announcer: one who would prepare people for the Christ and His kingdom. See also Mark 1:1-4 cp. Malachi 3:1; Isaiah 40:3-4.

John 1:6-8 – John the Baptist / Baptizer came to be a witness to the truth of that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of the living God, the Light of the world. See John 5:30-39; 10:41.

- John the Baptist was carefully prepared to be one who would point people to Jesus.
- John told the truth about who Jesus is and called people to repent of their sin and believe on Jesus, the Son of God.
- John called for commitment and a public confession of their faith by baptizing those who repented and believed.
- John emphasized, not only Christ's work of being our Savior and taking away our sin, but he also emphasized that Christ was our Lord, who came to establish His kingdom.

Where do we fit in with this message"

- Have you repented of your sin and believed on the only begotten Son of God?
- Do you trust what Christ did on the cross, to pay for your sins and satisfy the righteous demands of the Father.
- Have you also surrendered to His authority and kingdom? Are you following Christ and serving in His kingdom?
- Have you confessed your faith in Christ to others? Have you followed the Lord's example and His ordinance of baptism, to show your faith to others?
- Are you reaching out to others, calling them to repentance from sin and faith in Christ, as John did?
