Every Day Is Father's Day!
Selected Scriptures
(Deut. 6:4-7; Proverbs; Col. 3:21; Eph. 5)
Reading: Genesis 2:18-25

I was in *meeting* a few days ago in which we touched on *Sunday School* and *Children's Ministry*.

We wrote down the *names* of every child here under the age of **10** we could think of.

Perhaps 25% of our Sunday morning crowd is made up of *children*!

Which means we have a lot of *proud dad's* this morning! ©

And, God says you men have some weighty, life-shaping responsibilities.

The Bible says men are to *love* God completely and *train* their children accordingly.

God has appointed father's to train their children.

- 1. The father's conviction Deut 6:4-6
- 2. The father's charge Deut 6:7
- 3. The father's counsel samples from the wisdom of Proverbs
- 4. The father's coaching Col 3:21; Eph 6:4

## The father's conviction – Deut 6:4-6

- 1. Let's begin by turning together in our **OT** to **Deut 6:4-7**, a jugular text in terms of its importance to **Judaism**, and to you & me. **Read 6:4-7** 
  - a. **Deuteronomy** is the fifth of the *Five Books of Moses* (*Penta*teuch; *Law*; Gen, Ex, Lev, Num, **Deut**).
  - b. The book is *framed-up* around **three** *major addresses* that Moses gave to Israel, as the **2**<sup>nd</sup> generation prepared to *leave* the Wilderness (**40** years) and *enter* the Promised Land. *Without Moses...*!
    - i. Moses gave these three speeches to *prepare* God's people to *enter* the Land of Promise...
    - ii. ...to conquer...
    - iii. ...and to *flourish*.
  - c. Our text is found in Moses' **second** *speech*.
  - d. It is important to note that Israel's leader had just finished reviewing the *Ten Commandments* in chapter 5 (same speech). So the shadow of the *Commandments* casts itself over the *charge* we consider this morning in chapter 6.
- **2.** "Hear, O Israel! The LORD our God, the LORD is one!" The Hebrew name for our text is "The Shema." "Shema" (Heb) means "hear."
  - **a.** The people of Israel were called to pay *attention* to life's fundamental truth:
    - i. God is. He exists...
    - **ii.** God is one.
      - **1.** The Hebrew term "one" suggests *unity* (not simply *singleness*), which leaves the door open for a *Trinitarian* understanding of Moses' declaration.
      - 2. "One" also suggests uniqueness. There is no other god!

- 3. God's people are commanded to *love* Him with *every fiber of their being*.
  - a. V.5 "You shall love the LORD your God with all your **heart** and with all your **soul** and with all your **might**.
  - b. You **don't** need to put these three words (*heart*, *soul*, *might*) under a *theological microscope*!
  - c. Moses' point is *clear*: your love for God should *all-encompassing*, *engaging all* that you are. Nothing held back!
  - d. Jesus simply called this (Mt 22) "The Great and Foremost Commandment."
- 4. Moses goes on (6) to *clarify* how to pursue this "*Great Commandment Love*":
  - a. "These words" are the immediate command (4,5) to love the one true God with heart & soul & might...
  - b. But "these words" are also detailed by the instructions of God's good Law; just rehearsed by Moses in chapter five.
  - c. So loving God is expressed *day by day* by keeping these *Ten Words of the Law*. With *heart-felt, all consuming* obedience.
- 5. This is Father's Day. My sermon title is "Every Day Is Father's Day." But I haven't said a word about fatherhood & children yet. What's up!?!
  - a. You can't teach your kids to love God, if you don't love God.
  - b. You can't lead your children to Jesus, unless you are following Jesus.

So being a dad begins in your heart: to love God w/ everything that you are, then instill your love in your kids.

## The father's charge (vv.6,7)

- 1. Israel is about to *conquer* the Promised Land, but the first priority is **not** to *sharpen their swords* but to *sharpen their sons*!
  - a. I was taken by the fact that Moses' command began with the *entire* nation (v.4 "Hear, O Israel!") then immediately focused on fathers and families.
  - b. Ever since **Gen 2**, the Bible has taught that the family is the *basic* building block of society. That is *still true* today!
  - c. Which adds *great importance* (weight) to your charge, men!
- 2. Vv.6-7 "**These words**, which I am commanding you today, shall be on your heart. You shall **teach them diligently** to your sons...
  - a. Brother's, your *charge* is to *teach* your sons and daughters according to "these words"; again, here is God's *core curriculum*:
    - i. **V.4** There is one true God, the God of the Bible. Thus...
    - ii. V.5 You are to love Him with all that you are (heart, soul, strength).
    - iii. Your love for Him implies your obedience to Him!
    - iv. Your teaching implies *this message* to your children: "you are to *love Him* the way *I love Him*..."
  - b. Your teaching is to be *diligent*. This will be *a life-long project*. It will demand your daily *attention*.

- 3. That's clearly seen in **v.7**, as God gives us instructions on *training our children* (**read v.7**).
  - a. The lesson plan encompasses when & where!
  - b. Sitting in the house together, walking the road together.
  - c. Turning in at night, getting up in the morning.
  - d. Game night and homework; taking a walk and going shopping.
  - e. Working in the kitchen and learning to mow the yard.
  - f. Settling squabbles and tending to broken hearts.
  - g. Teach these words...everywhere and all the time...
  - h. Because the Gospel speaks to all of these!
- 4. **I.e.** God is the *dominant topic*, the *ever-present guest*, in your home.
  - a. Father's, husbands, what *is* the *theme* of your family? Is it faith in God, sparked by *your* faith in God!
  - b. "This is my story, this is my song, praising my Savior, all the day long; this is my story, this is my song, praising my Savior, all the day long!"

Here is your charge, men: "teach them diligently."

## The father's counsel – important lessons from the wisdom of Proverbs

- 1. What does a king teach his *sons* his *children*?
  - a. That's an important question, because a good king cares who sits on his throne when he is *gone*.
    - i. He doesn't want to leave his kingdom to a *fool*!
  - b. King Solomon wrote the **OT** collection of Proverbs to document what he taught his sons.
  - c. It is a *treasure* of godly wisdom! Men, I encourage you to *read* Proverbs often and to *read* it (*explain* it) to your children regularly.
  - d. We've just established (Deut) that *fathers* are to love God and to constantly train their *family* to love God.
  - e. Now I want to turn to Proverbs to survey the *foundation* and the *building blocks* of training your family. .
- 2. Your foundation is found in **Proverbs 1:7**(reinforced 9:10; turn/read).
  - a. The Bible makes *fearing God* the prerequisite for knowledge/wisdom! If we connect that back to Deut 6...
    - i. If you love God w/all your heart, you will also fear Him.
    - ii. And if you *fear God*, you will want to obey Him by *teaching* your family *all the time/everywhere*. You will teach them to *fear, love* and *obey* Him. Like *you* do!
  - b. Let's suggest a few *definitions* and then a simple *explanation*.
    - i. *Wisdom* seeing and responding to everyday life from God's perspective. (Applying God's truth to life.)
    - ii. Fear of God responding to God with awe that draws us near and a holy fear that drives our obedience. The Bible teaches (OT/NT) that Christians are to fear God.

- c. So when you fear God you know you must see life and live life His way. I.e., the fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom.
- d. The connection (7) between the *fear of God* and *wisdom* argues that the values you teach your children must be taught in a Christian context.
  - i. E.g. We *work hard* because that honors God and His *creation mandate* (Gen 1 &2).
  - ii. We avoid sinful friendships because they drag us from God.
  - iii. Proverbs is not simply a *recipe book* for good conduct (moralism). It is an aid to teach your kids to live the *Christian life*.
- 3. Let's build on the foundation (fear of God leading to wisdom) by briefly considering **three** subjects God wants you to teach your kids
  - a. In fact, these topics are *repeated* in Proverbs (often) because they are *essential* to growing in wisdom and godliness.
  - b. **Three** fundamentals to teach your kids (more): *friends, sexuality, work ethic.*
- 4. *Friends*. You are not the only person shaping your children's *character* and *world-view*. They are listening to their *peers*! Their peers are *pulling* on them!
  - a. Follow as I read 1:10-15. Sinners want to recruit your kids!
    - i. To "entice" is to persuade, to tempt. Wrong friends will work on your kids with peer pressure and bullying.
      - 1. V.11 "Come w/ us"; v.14 "Throw in your lot with us."
    - ii. You need to need to *train* your children to *resist* peer pressure. Instill in them the desire to *please* you and *fear* God.

- iii. The danger of wrong friends is well known.
  - 1. **Psalm 1:1** How blessed is the man who does **not** walk in the counsel of the wicked (stand/sinners sit/scoffers).
  - 2. **1 Cor 15:33** Do not be deceived: bad company corrupts good morals ("deceived"? we underestimate the power of peer pressure).
- b. Solomon illustrates the *pressure of wrong friends* with the example of a gang of *violent robbers*.
  - i. They suggest evil is fine... fun (11 ambush .... without cause).
  - ii. They promise it will be *easy* (12 *swallow them alive*).
  - iii. They tempt with profit (13 we will fill our houses with spoil).
- c. Some children are easier targets (naïve; people pleasers). Truthfully, some children are drawn to sinful people (glamorous; rebellion).
  - i. You must appeal to your kids!
    - 1. The bad influence says (11): "Come with us."
    - 2. You must repeat (10): "My son, if sinners entice you, do not consent." (15): "My son, do not walk in the way with them; keep your feet from their path."
  - ii. You must *train* your kids to stay away from the wrong friends! Again, v.15 *keep your feet from their path*."
    - 1. Because if they won't embrace *wisdom*, they'll probably embrace a *sinner*!

- 5. Sexuality. Western Culture is caught up in a revolution that began in the **1950s** and has grown in scope and influence to this day. It is a moral revolution a sexual revolution. I'm not going to take the time to develop that (need?), but I'm going to assert that we lost that fight.
  - a. The sexual revolution wants to take your children captive.
  - b. Father's need to prepare their children to resist.
  - c. Men (all), turn with me to 5:1-8 (read).
  - d. Let's begin by pointing out Solomon's appeal is *strong* (1): *give attention...incline your ear*. That underlines how *important* it is to protect your children from sexual sin.
  - e. The king gives *three* warnings concerning the adulteress:
    - i. She is *appealing* (3), beginning with her sweet, smooth *speech*. Sinful sexual encounters often begin with *flattery*.
    - ii. She is, however, *deadly* (4-5)! *Wormwood* suggests *suffering*. Her feet are on the path of *death*.
    - iii. Third, she doesn't even consider (6) how unstable she is!
  - f. Solomon's advice (7,8) is simple. It's the same advice as with any other bad friend: *remember what's right* (7) and *just stay away* (8)!
  - g. Proverbs (Bible) has *much more to say* about sexual sin. Brothers, my point this morning is that the *repeated presence* of this warning in Scripture means you *must* teach these truths to your family.
    - i. This is *high* on God's list of your children's training.

- 6. Hard work. I've got a friend who likes to say, "hard work ain't easy!"
  - a. There are "Hiring" signs up all over the city & country, but people don't want to work! There are pieces on the news (papers) about this problem every week!
  - b. But to be honest, *laziness* is an evidence of our sin nature, so *laziness* has been around ever since we got *evicted* from the Garden. Solomon wrote: "nothing new under the sun!"
  - c. Which means fathers have always needed to *train their children* to work! **Turn to 6:6-11 (read).** 
    - i. The hard-working **ant** *prepares* summer & fall for the approach of winter; that's just the way she is.
    - ii. The *sluggard* lies down when he should be working; that's just the way *he* is! His *sloth* will lead to *poverty*; *laziness* will rob him of riches as sure as a *bandit*. (11)
    - iii. Again, the Proverbs addresses the topic of *laziness* often; as does the **NT. 2 Thess 3:10** For even when we were with you, we used to give you this order: if anyone is not willing to work, then he is not to eat, either. This is a critical life lesson!
    - iv. When my *sons* were old enough to take their first jobs, I would tell them, "just show up on time and stay till the whistle blows, you'll be a hero!"
    - v. This week I ordered a new book by **Mary Beeke** (Dr.Joel) titled "Teach Them to Work: Building a Positive Work Ethic in Our Children" The book review included a brief article by Mrs. Beeke; I'd like to share an excerpt of her four pointers on instilling a work ethic in you kids. **Read M. Beeke's piece.**

7. God wants you to teach your kids His truths about *friends, sexuality, and work*. That's why those are *all over* your Bible! Yet, these **three** *subjects* are just an *important sample*: **Fathers**, I urge you to read through Proverbs and *build your own list of life lessons* for your kids (*character, communication, finances, substance abuse, authority ...on and on*). **Train your children!** 

## Finally, I'd like to coach you on your coaching techniques!

- 1. The Apostle Paul had a few coaching pointers for fathers. Let's look together in Col. 3:20-21 (<u>read</u>).
- 2. *Today* is *Father's Day*, so I need to point out something to our *children* from **v.20**: cheerfully *obeying your dad* is even better than a *card*, and it makes God happy, too!
- 3. *Men*, let's *spend a minute* thinking about **v.21** (read).
  - a. Here is Paul's *parenting pointer*: Fathers do not *exasperate* your children!
  - b. "Exasperate" irritate, provoke, stir up.
  - c. **Eph 6:4,** Paul's parallel warning: do not stir them up to anger
  - d. Dads, you are to communicate in a way that assures your kids will hear your message without being frustrated (hurt, turned off) by your delivery.
- 4. This was a *revolutionary* directive. **First century** father's (Roman, Jews) generally *laid down the law* with little concern for the feelings of their *wives* and *children*. Christianity *directly challenged* accepted family patterns!
- 5. What coaching blunders can *exasperate* your children...? Here are some warnings (not too fast)... *harsh discipline* (re speech; "rod"), *setting the bar too high* (re age), *no discipline* (kids want bounds), *favoritism* (Jacob & Joseph), *no training, no attention/affection, no sacrifice* (time, advantage, comfort/security, indulge), *inconsistency* (yours), *hypocrisy* (yours).
- 6. Where does a child's *exasperation* (anger) lead? *Slow obedience*, *sulky obedience*, *no obedience*. Perhaps, eventually ... *abandoning*, *repudiating* your values and your faith.

Men, take the time and trouble to train your children w/o exasperating your children; bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

A few years ago my **youngest** graduated from *college* and headed off to the *Marine Corp*'s OCS.

An engineer and an officer. Man...I was one proud dad!

Then one morning at *breakfast*, just after he left home, I was *thinking* about all of that....

And I began to cry a little. I had to admit to Joanie: "No one needs me any more."

Men, don't waste a single day of being a husband and a father.

Walk in the fear of the Lord.

Love your wife unselfishly and tenderly.

*Train* you sons and daughters in your faith – all the time and everywhere.

*Teach* them to value what God values (today: *friends*, *purity*, *hard work*...more).

*Coach* consistently, *coach* compassionately.

And, **OBTW dads**, I was wrong about working myself out of a job!

Children and grandchildren will always listen to advice of a wise, old man!

May that be *you*, in God's good time...
