INTRODUCTION: (v. 1)

\*Don't be fooled by the glitter, glamour, and glee of the wicked!

- I. The <u>PROSPERITY</u> of the Wicked (v. 4-12)
  - A. The APPEARANCE of the Wicked (v. 4-5)
    - 1. They appear to be <u>comfortable even at death</u> (v. 4)
    - 2. They appear to be <u>free from trouble</u> (v. 5)
  - B. The ARROGANCE of the Wicked (v. 6, 8-9)
  - C. The ABUNDANCE of the Wicked (v. 7, 12)
  - D. The IGNORANCE of the Wicked (v. 11)

## II. The PERPLEXITY of the Righteous (v. 2-3, 13-16)

The apparent success of the wicked is a temptation even to the righteous:

- A. There is a temptation to ENVY those who prosper (v. 2-3)
- B. There is a temptation to <u>QUESTION</u> the value of righteousness (v. 13)
- C. There is a temptation to COMPLAIN over one's troubles (v. 14-16)

## III. The <u>PUNISHMENT</u> of the Wicked (v. 17-20)

- A. Their end is <u>DESTRUCTION</u> (v. 17-18)
- B. Their end is <u>DESOLATION</u> (v. 19)
- C. Their end is DREAD (v. 19b)
- D. Their end is <u>DESPISED</u> (v. 20)

## IV. The <u>PRECEPTS</u> for the Righteous (v. 22-26)

- A. Things are not always what they appear to be (v. 22)
- B. The Lord is the greatest asset anyone could have (v. 23-26)
  - 1. He is <u>with</u> me (v. 23)
    - a. His presence is <u>continual</u> (v. 23)
    - b. His presence is personal (v. 23b-24)
    - c. His presence is desirable (v. 25)
    - d. His presence is <u>eternal</u> (v. 26)
  - 2. He <u>holds</u> me (v. 23b)
  - 3. He <u>quides</u> me (v. 24a)
  - 4. He receives me (v. 24b)
  - 5. He satisfies me (v. 25; cp. v. 1)
  - 6. He <u>strengthens</u> me (v. 26)
