II. **1 Corinthians 1:1-3 Exposition**

- A. Who is the letter from? (vs 1)
 - 1. Paul an apostle of Christ Jesus, by the will of God (1 Cor 15:3-10)
 - 2. Sosthenes, our brother (Acts 18:12-18)
- B. The recipients of this letter (vs 2)
 - 1. The church of God at Corinth
 - 2. those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints
 - a. is *saint* really an appropriate term for the Corinthians?
 - b. sainthood links the church to God's holy nation
 - (Lev 19:1,2, Ex 19:5-6)
 - c. the passive perfect participle of the verb *hagiadzo* indicates a **present condition** – this is how **sanctification** is most often discussed in the New Testament
 - 3. with all who in every place call on the name of Jesus Christ ...
 - a. he wanted them (and us) to keep the universal church in mind b. there is great glory in this idea (Malachi prophesied this)
- C. The blessings on those who are receiving this letter (vs 3)
 - 1. Grace to you and peace ...
 - 2. The blessings are uniquely directed to the church those in Christ

III. What is a saint? What does it look like to be sanctified or holy?

- What **holiness** is **not** (from 1 Corinthians)
- 1. It is not mere *knowledge* (1 Cor 13:2)
- 2. It is not mere *morality*
- 3. It is not merely *asceticism* or *self-denial* (1 Cor 9:4-14, 13:3)
- 4. It is not *legalism* (1 Cor 6:12)
- 5. It is not merely having a *clear conscience* (1 Cor 4:3-4)
- B. What **holiness** is (from 1 Corinthians)
 - 1. It is strangeness or peculiarity (1 Cor 1:20-22, 26-29, 2:14)
 - 2. It is being set apart for God's special use (1 Cor 3:16-17, 6:16-20)
 - 3. It involves *purity* (1 Cor 5:6, 13, 6:9-11)
 - 4. It involves *temperance* and *self-denial* (1 Cor 9:27)
 - 5. It follows after love and brother affection (1 Cor 10:24, 13:5)
 - 6. It is longing for the resurrection (1 Cor 13:12, 15:58)
 - 7. More on holiness in this life it is like gold mixed with dross

IV. Why is your sainthood important?

A. Because God is holy and the holiness of the church is to reflect His holiness, so let us live as a holy people (1 Cor 5:7)
