

**The Suffering Servant**  
**Sin's Power To Separate, The Servant's Power To Save**  
**Isaiah 50**

- I. Sin's Power To Separate (1-3)
  - A. God asks a series of questions
  - B. Category 1 – WHOSE FAULT IS THIS?  
(Where is the divorce certificate/to whom did I sell you?)
    - 1. The “divorce” is not without cause – sin
    - 2. The “selling” is not without cause – sin
  - C. Category 2 – WHY DID YOU NEGLECT THE TRUTH? (Why was there no man/none to answer?)
  - D. Category 3 – DON'T YOU BELIEVE I CAN DO SOMETHING ABOUT THIS? (Is my hand too short/do I have no power?)
    - 1. Example of the Exodus
    - 2. God is a powerful judge and deliverer
- II. The Servant's Power To Save (4-11)
  - A. The work of the Servant
    - 1. The “learned” tongue
    - 2. A word to sustain the weary
    - 3. Daily learns things from the Father
    - 4. Complete obedience to God
    - 5. Endures significant suffering
    - 6. Absolute boldness and singularity of mission
  - B. The Servant asks a series of questions
  - C. Category 1 – WHO CAN STAND AGAINST ME? (Contend/Has a case/Condemns)
    - 1. Many will try
    - 2. None will succeed

- D. Category 2 – WHO WILL BE DELIVERED?  
(Fears/Obeys?)
  - 1. Faith and repentance
  - 2. Trust in LORD and rely on God
- E. A warning to the idolatrous – I am also a judge
