 - The advance of Crown Prince Nebuchadnezzar, 605 at Carchemish, defeating Assyria and Egypt, then advances to Jerusalem
 - First of three exiles, 605 BC
 - Nebuchadnezzar succeeds Nabopolassar
 - Taking the sacred objects
 - His perspective
 - God's perspective

God's Sovereignty: He Determines When and Where We Live, Acts 17.26

- Born in the USA 20th- 21st Centuries
 - o Bible: responsible citizens, Mark 12.17; Romans 13.1-7
 - o Born Again into God's kingdom, John. 3.3,5
 - Allegiance to King Jesus, Colossians 1.13-14
 - Obey God rather than people, Act 5.39
- Temptation: Chestnut Mountain
 - Back porch/no other houses

- Gather family: Tunnel vision
- Genesis 1.28: Changes everything
 - o Matthew 28.19-20 and Acts 1.8: changes everything
 - Matthew 5.13-16: changes everything
 - II Peter 3.18 changes everything
- Daniel taken into exile and chosen for leadership

Delicate balance: American Patriot and Child of the King

- Biblical Models: Abraham, Isaac and Jacob: Hebrews 11.9,10; Lot's failure, Genesis 14, 19; Joseph and Esther
- Parallel: God's people in exile
 - O Withdraw and wait?
 - Jeremiah's challenge: the letter that changed everything, Jeremiah
 29.5-7
 - Get involved in life, 29.5-6
 - Seek the welfare of the city and pray for it, 29.7
- Daniel's implementation: Six vignettes, then 6 chapters of prophecy
 - o Daniel 1: Make the best of a bad situation
 - Submissive courage
 - The power of humility (runs through his life)
 - o Daniel 2: Certainty of Christ's triumph in history
 - Hope: Jesus wins
 - God uses nations: four empires
 - Revelation
 - Daniel 3: Christ's powerful presence in a crisis
 - Daniel 4: World leaders
 - Proud Heart of Nebuchadnezzar
 - Respectful approach of David
 - Right view of the church/state: inform each other, but separate spheres
- Daniel 5: Courage to proclaim God's judgment
- Daniel 6: Learn David's "secret"
 - Prayer
 - Civil disobedience
