I. It is a gift II. It is a stewardship

- I. The Communion of the Savior with the Saints is a gracious gift
- A. Peter began his letter with spelling the believer's gift (1:2-3)
 - 1. Every aspect of the gift of salvation is grace (3-5)
 - 2. Every aspect of the gift belongs all believers (LD 21.55)
- B. Communion of the Savior and the saints defined
 - 1. Communion with our Lord is the experiential truth of Romans 5:1-2
 - 2. Yet communion with our Lord is far more than experiential moments a. as believers in Jesus we are partakers of Him (1 Cor. 3:21-23)
 - b. what are we partakers in?
 - Romans 8:1
 - Phil. 4:13
 - Phil. 4:19
 - Eph. 2:6
 - Phil. 3:21

II. The Communion of saints with fellow saints is a stewardship

A. Communion of saints with saints is also not merely having spiritual talks

1. By all means have those: for God is listening and recording: Malachi 3:16

- B. Communion of saints is to share or use your gifts to benefit of others
 - 1. According to 1 Peter 4:10 every saint has received a gift (1 Cor. 12:11) a. the gifts are manifold or varied vs. 10b:
 - b. all the gifts are important
 - c. you learn how you are gifted thru callings you get
 - 2. Every saint is to minister his/her gift to one another as good stewards
 - a. a good steward realizes that all he/she manages is not his/her
 - God gifted us to contribute to whole of the church (body)
 - b. good steward also realizes Master expects us to grow His talent
 - Matt. 25:14-23

Reflection: Do we think Biblically about the *communion of saints?*

- A. A true believer is no more an **individual** but a member of Christ's body
 - 1. Read Hebrews 13:3 in light of Acts 9:4
 - 2. Recall the early Christian's fellowship in Acts 2, 4
 - 3. Meditate through some examples of the Christian's call for *one another* a. 1 Thess. 5:14 Gal 6:1-2 Romans 15:14
- B. A true believer has a calling to cultivate their gift for greater usefulness
