- **D.** The Banquet House speaks of the wine of Christ's Blood
 - 1) Shed for us five times: (a) in His circumcision to fulfill the Law for us, (b) in the Garden to begin suffering the anguish of God's wrath for us, (c) in His scouring by whose stripes we are healed, (d) in His passion to make atonement for our sins, (e) and in His pierced side to show the double grace accomplished in His death (justification and sanctification), as well as to show the efficacy of the sacraments as signs and seals of righteousness just as blood and water flowed from His side.
 - **2)** The Lord's Supper (1 Cor 11:25)
- **E.** Here we have the Risen Christ
- **F.** Christ is able and willing to save us
 - 1) As seen in the wedding of Cana, Christ is able to make the best wine (Jn 2:9-10)
 - 2) Christ is able to fill the house of wine with His guests (Mt 22:2-10)

- **A.** But how can I know that I have entrance into this banquet hall (Mt 22:11-13)
- **B.** But what if I am in the house of mourning rather than the hall of feasting? Take heart, for:
 - 1) There is the witness to Christ in our sufferings (Col 1:24)
 - 2) There is the comfort of Christ in His sufferings (2 Cor 1:5)
 - 3) There is the blessing of Christ in imitating Him (Eccl 7:2)
 - 4) There is the maturing in Christ through sufferings (Ex 17:1-6)
 - 5) There is the anticipation of Christ in the end of our sufferings.

rv. Uses (Applications) from the Text

- **A.** Let us consider the great benefits of the banquet hall of Christ in this life (Psa 104:15)
- **B.** Let us consider the great benefits of the banquet hall of Christ upon our death (I Cor 13:13)
- **C.** Are we not convicted of many sins?
 - 1) The sin of drunkenness, which prefers the worldly house of wine to the heavenly (Eph 5:18)
 - 2) The sin of self-sufficiency, as if we could bring ourselves to Christ's banqueting house; or, even worse, as if we would prefer our own house of wine to His.
 - 3) The sin of discontentment, neglecting that we have all we could ever need or desire in Christ.
- **D.** Let us, therefore heed the warning: For if we shall not be brought into the house of wine by Christ, we shall be the winepress which He treads (Isa 63:3)
- **E.** Let us be renewed in this covenant with God, delighting in Him and walking in holiness.
