Questions to Discuss and Consider at Home or in Small Group:

- 1. Who came to Jesus and knelt before Him? What did this person want (v. 18)?
- 2. As Jesus was going on the way to help this person, what interrupted His journey (v. 20)? What happened (v. 22)?
- 3. What happened with the person who first came to Jesus (vv. 23-25)?
- 4. What did Jesus say that caused the gathered mourners to laugh at Jesus (v. 24b)? What did Jesus mean by this?
- 5. As Jesus was returning home, who followed Him? What did they want (v. 27)?
- 6. What was the challenging question Jesus asked these men (v. 28b)? How did they answer Jesus (v. 28c)? What happened (v. 29)?
- 7. What stern warning did Jesus issue to these two men (v. 30)? Why do you think Jesus warned them as He did?
- 8. What was the reason that a man brought to Jesus was not able to speak (v. 32)? What happened to this man (v. 33a)?
- 9. How did the crowds react to all that Jesus had done? What did they exclaim (v. 33)?
- 10. Who were not impressed with Jesus' exorcism of the demon? How did they explain what Jesus did (v. 34)?
- 11. Is faith meritorious (does it earn God's favor)? Why or why not? What is the role of faith in the life of the Christian?
- 12. What is meant by the term "saving faith"?
- 13. Have there been any situations, circumstances, or events in your life that have led you to look beyond yourself to something greater? If so, what?
- 14. In what way (or ways) are you confronted with the choice to believe every time you read or hear God's Word? How would reading Genesis 1 challenge you to believe? How would hearing about Abraham, Isaac, or Jacob challenge you to believe? How would the genealogies of 1 Chronicles challenge you to believe?

15. Does your lack of faith limit God's power? Why or why not? Is there any sense in which a person's lack of faith "limits" the work of God in his or her life?
