Introduction

- 1. This Word of God reminded the Jewish Christians of their secure hope in Jesus Christ.
- 2. We have a hope that is secure for it is an anchor of the soul.

The Idea

- 1. The Holy Spirit uses a figure of speech to teach us about the security of our hope: an anchor.
 - a. The anchor in the text is unique and special because instead of going down into the sea, this anchor goes up into heaven.
 - b. The idea of the text is that this anchor of the soul is secure both sure and steadfast.
- 2. We desperately need this anchor of the soul because of the storms of life.

The Basis

- 1. The basis of this secure hope is that Jesus ascended into heaven and is now there.
 - a. The word forerunner is a nautical term.
 - b. Can anything break this line to the anchor? Can anything remove us from this anchor?
- 2. There is an important question that follows: how do I receive this security for my soul?

The Comfort

- 1. Because all of this is true, we have a powerful comfort. Hebrews 6:18
- 2. This security leads not to careless or apathy or indifference, but it leads to a desire to hold on to Christ and to follow in His ways.
