Introduction

- 1. The experienced apostle Paul writes to the younger, rookie preacher to encourage him in his work.
- 2. This is an important word for you young people and for all of us for two reasons especially.

The Things Learned

- 1. What are these things you have learned and are assured of?
- 2. These things are more fully described in the text as:
 - a. The things you have learned from the time you were little children. 2 Timothy 3:15
 - b. All this you have learned is described in the text as the very content of your faith.

The High Calling

- 1. The entirety of your lives must be directed by this truth of God's Word you have learned.
 - a. The negative aspect implied by the word is, "Don't depart from it."
 - b. Positively, God's Word demands that we live our lives by continuing in the things we have learned.
- 2. The Word of God sets the bar high for us; the more you know of God and His truth, the more responsible you are to continue in truth and in godliness.

The Encouraging Reasons

- 1. First, "knowing of whom thou hast learned them."
 - a. Who is Paul speaking of here?
 - b. Why should this be a reason to continue in the things we have learned?
- 2. Second, these things are able to make us wise unto salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.
