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Fruit of False Teachers

1 Timothy 6:4-5 (NASB)

...he is conceited and understands nothing; but he has a morbid interest in controversial questions and disputes about words, out of which arise envy, strife, abusive language, evil suspicions, and constant friction between men of depraved mind and deprived of the truth, who suppose that godliness is a means of gain.

- See Gal. 5:22 -23 for the fruit of the Spirit
- The revealed purpose of God (Acts 20:27) taught by Paul in Ephesus, does not produce this!

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Fivefold Collection of Calamities

- Envy
- Strife
- Malicious talk
- Evil Suspicions
- Constant friction with three-fold effect
 - Corrupted thinking
 - Wranglings and animosities
 - Supposing godliness should produce gain

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Those Who Are the Lord's Turn From What Brings Dishonor

2 Timothy 2:19-20 (NASB)

Nevertheless, the firm foundation of God stands, having this seal, "The Lord knows those who are His," and, "Everyone who names the name of the Lord is to abstain from wickedness." Now in a large house there are not only gold and silver vessels, but also vessels of wood and of earthenware, and some to honor and some to dishonor.

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What It Means to Honor God

2 Timothy 2:21-22 (NASB)

Therefore, if anyone cleanses himself from these things, he will be a vessel for honor, sanctified, useful to the Master, prepared for every good work. Now flee from youthful lusts and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, with those who call on the Lord from a pure heart.

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Stay Awake and Be Concerned

Acts 20:31 (NASB)

Therefore be on the alert, remembering that night and day for a period of three years I did not cease to admonish each one with tears.

- Be on the alert is gregoreo_ (22 times in NT)
- This corresponds to the imperative (guard) vs 28
- The dangers are real, be on guard and awake
- Paul's example showed intense, personal teaching and care for each one
- He did not stop or get distracted

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
