3.	The Jews who were around Jesus knew about the Messianic prophecies that had been given to David and the prophets. For instance, read John 1:35-51 and list all of the titles or descriptions given to Jesus as they discover who He is. You should find at least 7.
4.	Compare the prophecy of 2 Samuel 7:12-13 with the words of Gabriel in Luke 1:32-33. How does understanding the Old Testament prophecy help to understand what's going on at the opening of the book of Luke?
5.	Sometimes the authors of the New Testament quoted prophecies directly from the Old Testament that Jesus Christ had fulfilled. Other times they would summarize the Old Testament and lead then tell of the person and work of Jesus the Christ. Paul does this in Acts, beginning at verse sixteen.
