C. The revelation of God requires that His children are found blameless at the Lord's return, (vs. 5: 12 – 28) 1. Blamelessness Requires That We Submit To The Authority God Has Ordained For His Church, (vs. 12)

As long as parents encourage in their children such a course, as we have animadverted on above, either by being silent as to its evil tendency, or by giving up the reins of authority in their own houses, we cannot reasonably have any other expectation than that the evil lamented will spread and strengthen. We therefore, earnestly call upon and intreat you, if your children's spiritual interests are dear to your hearts, if your own peace and comfort are dear to you, - if the glory of God and the welfare of Zion are dear to you, - to think seriously what is your duty in the case, and resolutely set yourselves to its performance. Do you ask, what can we do to prevent the evil, or avert its progress. We answer—there are two things which you can do, and which every parent ought to do. -1st. You can take pains to teach those under your, care, the evil and danger of such indulgences as we have specified. You can, with the word of God in your hands, admonish them of their duty, remind them of their obligations as members of the Church of Christ, and affectionately and perseveringly urge their compliance. - 2nd. You can, should your admonitions fail in whole or- in part, exercise your authority, as having absolute rule in your own houses. Whatever sin may be in such amusements, either in the thing itself, or in the degree of it, will-be surely prevented, if every Master of a household will exercise the legitimate authority with which God has invested him. ~~ Associated Presbytery of Miami

"We Ask You Brothers"-

"I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." (Ephesians 4:1–3, ESV)

12.2) Is Our Submission Informed As To What Labor Is Done?

"To Respect (Pres.Act.Inf- οίδα, to know)

Those Who Labor (Pres.Act.Part) Among You"- "So receive him in the Lord with all joy, and honor such men, for he nearly died for the work of Christ, risking his life to complete what was lacking in your service to me." (Philippians 2:29-30,

I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; and from among your own selves will arise men speaking twisted things, to draw away the disciples after them. Therefore be alert, remembering that for three years I did not cease night or day to admonish every one with tears." (Acts 20:28–31, ESV)

12.4) Are We Really Willing To Receive Corrective Instruction?

"And Admonish (Pres.Act.Part) You"-

"As for those who persist in sin, rebuke them in the presence of all, so that the rest may stand in fear. In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus and of the elect angels I charge you to keep these rules without prejudging, doing nothing from partiality. Do not be hasty in the laying on of hands, nor take part in the sins of others; keep yourself pure." (1 Timothy 5:20-22, ESV)

- 1) "Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, 2) as those who will have to give an account. 3) Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you. 4) Pray for us, for we are sure that we have a clear conscience, desiring to act honorably in all things."
