NT: 1 Corinthians 6:1-11

Theme: A woman's (or a man's) power and honor are not necessarily tied to a position or title – but rather, to speaking the truth with humility, knowledge and discretion. It is this that accomplishes the purposes of God.

Background: Moving from an overview of a woman's role in the church and society to a specific example. Abigail gives a picture of decisive action and wise counsel in a delicate and dangerous situation.

Introduction: Abigail – average, every day, ordinary woman.

- Courting Disaster
  - A. Nabal's folly
    - 1. Nabal's protector
      - a. David in the region of Carmel
      - b. Keeping Nabal's "assets" safe (7)
    - 2. David's modest request (8)
    - 3. Nabal's foolish insult (10, 11)
  - B. David's folly
    - 1. He responds in kind!
    - 2. With 400 armed men (21-22)

TRANSITION: While word goes to David – it also goes to Abigail

- II. Decisive Character
  - A. Abigail's quick action!
    - 1. She is informed
      - a. Of David's protection (14-17)
      - b. Of Nabal's action
    - 2. Grasping the situation
      - a. Threat of immediate danger
      - b. Threat of future trial
    - 3. She "makes haste" Want peace? Don't wait till the enemy is at the door. (Luke 14:32)
      - a. A generous gift is prepared
      - b. A plan is laid Sends the gift in front of her (Jacob/Esau? Genesis 32)
  - B. Without permission
    - 1. To protect her husband and her household
    - 2. Acting lawfully to protect life (6th Commandment)
    - 3. In God's providence, they meet
- III. Disarming Diplomacy
  - A. Abigail's position one of humility
    - 1. Physically face to the ground (23)
      - a. Contrast with Nabal
      - b. "Hear the words of your servant" (24)
    - 2. Spiritually takes the blame!

(NOTE: Abigail pictures the heart of the Gospel.)

- a. Lay the guilt on me (24)
  - 1) Husband was foolish
  - 2) I should have seen guests
  - 3) So others won't suffer destruction

- b. Forgive the trespass of your servant (28)
- c. Don't shed this blood (26)
  - He spared Saul (Chapter 24)
- B. Her present
  - 1. David had asked for "whatever you have at hand"
  - 2. A "gift" not a "payoff"
- C. Her petition
  - 1. The promise of God to David (28, 29)
    - a. The Lord will build his house
    - b. You are fighting the battles of the Lord
    - c. "Evil shall not be found in you"
    - d. The Lord will keep you safe (The bundle)
    - e. Appointed prince over Israel
  - 2. Give no cause for regret!
    - How will you be known and remembered?
  - 3. Remember me
    - a. Not as one you destroyed out of vengeance
    - b. But as one who served you and received mercy
- IV. David's Praise
  - A. He is blessed
  - B. He gives blessing: Blesses Abigail go in peace
- V. Conclusion/Application
  - A. Our "title" doesn't exemplify or exalt Christ our character does.
  - B. Your sex doesn't limit your ability to exhibit and express the truth.
