Cain shows the love of sin and its sad consequences. (Part A)

We see:

1. The lover of sin worships God (vv. 3-5).
2. The lover of sin is warned by God (vv. 6,7).
3. The downward spiral of sin (v. 8).

The Heidelberg Catechism

4. Q. What does God's law require of us?

A. Christ teaches us this in a summary in Matthew 22: *You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.*[1] *This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the law and the prophets.*[2]
[1] Deut. 6:5. [2] Lev. 19:18.

5. Q. Can you keep all this perfectly?

A. No,[1] I am inclined by nature to hate God and my neighbor.[2]

The Westminster Confession of Faith

WCF 6.1 Our first parents, being seduced by the subtlety and temptation of Satan, sinned in eating the forbidden fruit.(1) This their sin, God was pleased, according to His wise and holy counsel, to permit, having purposed to order it to His own glory.(2)

WCF 6.2 By this sin, they fell from their original righteousness and communion with God,(1) and so became dead in sin,(2) and wholly defiled in all the parts and faculties of soul and body.(3)

WCF 6.3 They being the root of all mankind, the guilt of this sin was imputed,(1) and the same death in sin and corrupted nature conveyed to all their posterity, descending from them by ordinary generation.(2)

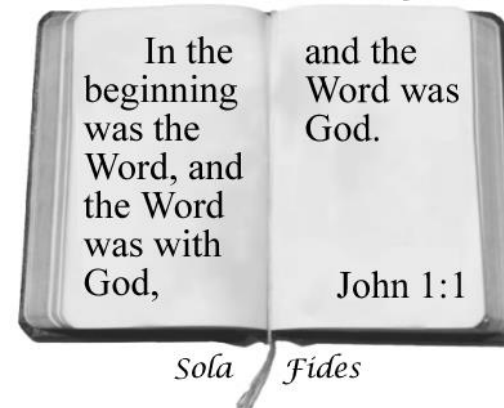
