WCF Ch 1, Of the Holy Scripture, 1: Although the light of nature, and the works of creation and providence do so far manifest the goodness, wisdom, and power of God, as to leave men inexcusable; (Ps. 19:1–3) yet they are not sufficient to give that knowledge of God, and of his will, which is necessary unto salvation. WLC Q. 157: How is the Word of God to be read? A. The holy Scriptures are to be read with an high and reverent esteem of them; (Psalm 19:10) with a firm persuasion that they are the very Word of God, and that he only can enable us to understand them; with desire to know, believe, and obey the will of God revealed in them; with diligence, and attention to the matter and scope of them; with meditation, application, self-denial, and prayer. WLC Q. 95: Of what use is the moral law to all men? A. The moral law is off use to all men, to inform them of the holy nature and the will of God, and of their duty, binding them to walk accordingly; to convince them of their disability to keep it, and of the sinful pollution of their nature, hearts, and lives: (Psalm 19:11) to humble them in the sense of their sin and misery, and thereby help them to a clearer sight of the need they have of Christ, and of the perfection of his obedience. WCF 15, Of Repentance unto life, 5: Men ought not to content themselves with a general repentance, but it is every man's duty to endeavour to repent of his particular sins, particularly (Ps. 19:13)
