Brief Overview

- ***1-11** - Primeval History
 - ***1-3** - Creation, Paradise, Fall
 - ***4-11** - Beginnings of Human History
- ***12-50** - Patriarchal History
 - ***12-25** - Abr
 - ***25-26** - Isaac & Ishmael
 - ***27-35** - Jacob & Esau
 - ***36-50** - Joseph & brothers

Tracing the Storyline & theme

- *Note the repeated “*good*” and “*blessed*” in Gen.1:
 - “*good*” ***4, 10, 12, 18, 21, 25, 31**
 - “*blessed*” ***1:22; 1:28; 5:1-2; 2:3; 6:8** (echo)
- ***Gen.4ff** → progression of human sin
- ***Gen.12** - turning point:
 - *Promises to Abraham
 - Land
 - Great Nation
 - Blessing to Abraham
 - Blessing to all the nations through Abraham
 - *cf. “*seed*” theme

- ***12-50** = blessing promised & restored

The Developing “Seed” Theme - “*offspring / descendants / children / family*”

- ***3:15** - the woman’s seed
- ***12ff** - Abraham’s seed
- *Special attention given to the “royal” line
 - ***17:6; 17:16; 35:11; 49:10**
- *Challenges to the promise
- Purpose of the Patriarchal narratives
 - cf. ***Mt.1:1; Jn.12:31; Gal.3:16**
